You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?

Type

This Product is a debt instrument issued in the form of an uncertified and intermediated security under Swiss law. Product terms and conditions are governed by Swiss law.

Objectives

This product allows the investor to participate in price movements of the Underlying and is therefore – in terms of risk comparable to a direct investment in the accordingly weighted Underlying Components. The product has no fixed lifetime and will be redeemed after the investor has exercised or the Issuer has terminated the product.

Redemption

Each investor has the right, annually on 1 December, to exercise the products for redemption by delivering a duly completed and signed redemption notice to the Issuer (the "Investor's Redemption"). 3. What happens if the Issuer is unable to pay out?
